

FROM OUR CEO

Dear Friends,

This will be my last report to you as Chief Executive Officer of Youth Homes. I will retire at the end of December 2016 after 24 years of service. It has been my honor to be the CEO of this non-profit organization. Youth Homes is made up of an outstanding team of employees and volunteers. Together we steadily expanded our services and strived to stay abreast of the latest and most innovative treatment models, always specializing in the care of severely traumatized youth. As a result, our relationships with our County partners has never been stronger.

For the second year in a row, Youth Homes ranked among the Top 100 Workplaces by the Bay Area News Group. We finished fiscal year 15/16 in the black with an improved balance sheet for the 15th consecutive year. This year, in partnership with the Youth Homes Auxiliary and Alamo Women's Club, we granted scholarships to nine to transition age youth.

In keeping with our commitment to helping foster kids find a job and remain employed, we have expanded our administrative office to open a Resource Center, a vital component of the Stepping Stones Workforce Development Program. The Center provides employment, life, and social skills workshops and activities. Funded entirely through private donations, this program is central to assuring that transitional age youth launch into a healthy and productive adulthood.

Earlier this year, the Board of Directors formed a Succession Committee and employed the highly respected Morrison & Berger to launch a nation-wide search for my successor. I am very pleased to share that Ms. Candy Espino has been chosen to be our new Chief Executive Officer. Ms. Espino brings 10 years of community-based executive experience and leadership to our agency. Her background in child welfare programs is extensive and similarly to Youth Homes, emphasizes the importance of county-based mental health services and social management. We are fortunate that she will be leading our team.

I am ending my tenure here with great confidence in our future. We are well positioned to thrive under the State of California Continuum of Care Reform (CCR). Our employees are truly engaged in the work and prepared for this major change in legislation. I could not ask for a greater group of people to work with. To each and every one of you, our community partners, I send my deepest appreciation for all the years of your support and guidance. This past quarter of a century passed in a heartbeat. It has been so rewarding to work for you.



Dominic Youth Homes Alumnus



Dominic came to Cherry Lane at 17, after being removed from a home of drugs and violence. One afternoon, the Aftercare Supervisor took Dominic on a hike to discuss continuing in Aftercare, a program for former foster youth during their transition to adulthood. Still needing and wanting support during this milestone period, Dominic chose to enroll. Now, a 21-year-old alumnus of Youth Homes, Dominic is able to talk about his journey. Recently he told us, "If this were a few months ago, I'd be crying telling you this. It's emotional for me."

hile in Aftercare and working on his therapeutic goals, Dominic proudly graduated from high school. He was connected with our Workforce Development Program and received help in identifying his long term goals, crafting his resume, and honing his interview skills. Dominic interviewed with a security company and got a job on the spot. He has been in the position for over two years!

Getting this job helped Dominic build confidence and recognize that he does not need to stay in unhealthy situations. He understood that he deserves to be respected and has self worth.

Dominic has also reconnected with his parents who are invested in mending their relationship. "My father wanted to show me that he was sorry. I didn't want to see it. I just wanted him to say it." This took some time, but Dominic did hear those meaningful words to help his healing process.

When asked what he would tell his 12 year old self, he said, "There's a brighter future." His words were followed by a long pause of silence and then, the tears started to fall.



Most of the funds to operate Youth Homes programs comes from government contracts with state and county agencies. These contracts outline specific services but do not always fund important complementary support activities. Private philanthropy gives Youth Homes the opportunity to try something new, something different, something more. "Donors enable the organization to find additional ways to help our clients, knowing it's the best thing to do even if it's not billable to the contract," shares Tim McCreery.

im and his wife, Patty, are loyal donors to Youth Homes. Their relationship with the agency began in earnest in 2000 when they created a more focused philanthropic agenda. After visiting a number of possible charitable organizations, Tim acknowledges that they decided to support Youth Homes because they were impressed with its focus and commitment to the welfare of the children. They believed in giving locally and believed in Youth Homes' mission. In addition to their financial support, Tim also donates his time. "It's critical to give time. Time is how we express our convictions and how we change the way things are."

When asked why they continue to donate, Tim responded that children are our future and Youth Homes is serving a severely under-served population; many of the kids have no other support, nowhere else to turn. Their hopes for Youth Homes are that it keeps getting better, it continues to navigate the political budget obstacles, and ultimately helps break the cycle of abuse in families. With continued support from our friends, like Patty and Tim, Youth Homes will continue to innovate and find ways to empower children and families.



Working with traumatized youth is not easy. It takes a team of special people who see the strengths in children, meet the kids where they are, and patiently work with them to heal from past trauma. Through our recruitment and on-boarding process, Youth Homes focuses on finding talented employees who are committed to youth, passionate, hard working and human in their approach.

here is a sweet side to all the kids. It may be a while before you see it, but it's there." Margie Darnes, one of our many loyal employees who are at the heart of the organization, shared about her work at Youth Homes.

Early in Margie's career, she had a difficult time finding a job that "fit" her. She was young, energetic, and wanted to work with children. After moving around, she landed at Youth Homes as a Relief Counselor working overnight shifts. She moved up the ranks as a result of hard work and her skills, and became a Residential Supervisor of Pryor, our crisis assessment shelter.

Now at Cherry Lane, Margie works with youth approaching 18 years old and preparing to age out of the foster care system. It's a "mold and push" balance. As they are getting ready to launch to independence, they need to learn to follow rules and how to handle anger in a positive manner. "Life is not a piece of cake. We need to prepare kids that there are going to be failures. But it's how they overcome them that will make or break them."

Now, 26 years after her first overnight shift, Margie has helped hundreds of children heal from trauma and begin to make their mark in the world. It's fair to say that Margie found her fit!

"Youth Homes is a crucial umbrella program for Contra Costa County," Stacy Wood stated without pause. "It's one of the few comprehensive placement and support service programs in the County that serves this population. The satellite services. such as one on one support, combined with therapeutic and behavioral treatment, elevate Youth Homes as a necessity for our County's families."

tacy Wood is no stranger to Youth Homes. She started her career in social services as a group home counselor for Youth Homes. Eventually Stacy became a child welfare worker for the county, where she has been for 19 years. Stacy works with transition age youth and believes "(Youth Homes) Aftercare is a huge saving grace – a vital component."

The partnership with the County is mutually beneficial. Youth Homes receives referrals and funding from County contracts. In return, Youth Homes provides a quality array of care that fills a gap in service.

Stacy reflected on transition age youth who lose eligibility for County services. When this occurs, resources from the County are lost, but Youth Homes can stay involved with the young adult to prevent them from falling through the cracks. They have Youth Homes staff helping them maintain focus on meeting the requirements for eligibility to regain services.

Our relationship and collaboration with the County, and other community partners, matter to us. The communication and joint effort to help a child succeed makes the outcomes stronger. The whole is truly greater than the sum of its parts.

une Krug is a former school administrator who was recruited to join the Auxiliary when she retired in 2004. Because of the numerous initiatives the Auxiliary organizes, June easily found a role within the organization that allowed her to be creative and bring different points of view to the group. Through fundraising events, the Thrift Shop, granting scholarships, mentoring youth, supplying holiday gifts, delivering birthday cakes and celebrating with the kids, the Auxiliary members are committed and dedicated to supporting foster youth during their time at Youth Homes and as they transition into adulthood.

With a chuckle, June shares there are lots of meetings at Youth Homes. "But, it has provided me with an education and is stimulating. I feel like I am contributing to the success of the kids."

The Auxiliary has provided countless hours of volunteer work and impacted thousands of children's lives. Without this source of support for the last 51 years, Youth Homes would look very different.
